#### First Day of School - Monday, August 12th

- The first day of school is Monday, August 12th. It is a HALF day of school.
- Please make arrangements to pick up your child at the end of the school day. There is no Extended Day Care. Bus service runs on minimum day schedule.
- Parents may walk their child to his or her classroom on the first day only.
- Students should wear regular day uniforms (Mass attire not required).

#### **Preparing for School: 6 Tips to Prepare for Success**

- 1. Attend the Meet the Teacher Night on Thursday, August 8 at 6 pm.
- 2. Sign up for bus transportation if you need it to get to school.
- 3. Celebrate the end of summer at the Back to School Bash at The Splash in Sherman from 6-8 pm.
- 4. Get fresh haircuts, check shirt/pant hem lengths, and check uniform quality. If you need to order new uniforms, visit <u>Tommy Hilfiger</u> or <u>DM Uniforms</u> for any pieces you need. Gently used uniforms will be available for purchase from HASA at Back to School Night.
- 5. Set up or check your lunch account in FACTS, and pack a healthy lunch for the first week of school.
- 6. Be on time! You may arrive at 7:45 am, and school starts promptly at 8:00 am.
- 7. Have patience in the afternoon carpool line. It always takes longer the first week as we settle into a routine and ensure the safety of our students.
- 8. Remember, there is no Extended Day Care on the first day of school.
- 9. Read the Weekly Newsletter every Friday to prepare for the week ahead.
- 10. Download the FACTS Family app in English or Spanish to order lunches, pay tuition and fees, and access other useful information.

#### **School Hours**

- The school day for all grades begins at 8:00 AM.
- Students should be in their seats at 8:00 or they will be counted tardy.
- Pre-K 1/2 day ends at 11:30 AM.
- All other classes end at 3:30 PM.
- All Early Release days end at 12:00 Noon. These days are noted on the school website and academic calendar.

#### **School Picture Day**

Students will take Fall photos on Wednesday, September 25th. Retakes and Class pictures will be taken on Wednesday, October 23rd.



#### **FACTS Student Information System**

To access this site for student and school information, parents must have an updated email in the school's management system. Parents are expected to access and utilize FACTS SIS for tracking their child's academic progress, updating information including authorized pick-up, contact information, change of address and medical information. To access FACTS:

- Go to the school website, click on the Parents tab, and FACTS/RenWeb.
- If it's your first time setting up your account, click "New Parent Login."
- District Code is STMARY-TX. Use the email address you gave to the school.
- Once your account is setup, login by clicking "Parent Login."

#### Lunch

St. Mary's School provides hot lunch every school day at the following prices:

- Hot Lunch Tray (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday): \$3.75
- Extra entree: \$1.00 (if available)
- Raising Canes/Chick-fil-A (Thursdays): \$4-\$8.
- Jimmy John's (Thursdays): \$6.
- Pizza (Fridays): \$1.25 per slice.
- Water: \$0.50

Lunch orders are taken **monthly** through FACTS. At the end of each month the school will charge accounts accordingly. Families may pay as you are billed (within 15 days or late fee) or keep a "toll-tag" supply that automatically reloads the lunch account to a predetermined amount (set by the parent).

Students will still be charged for advanced lunch orders (i.e. pizza, CFA, Canes) regardless of absence unless canceled prior to the deadline. In the event of such an absence, parents may pick up the ordered lunch at the designated lunch time.

If your child does not have lunch on a hot food day, they will be given what is served that day. If they don't bring lunch on a Thursday or Friday, they will get and be charged \$3 for a Lunchable. Peanut butter and jelly sandwiches will no longer be available for purchase.

If your child brings lunch from home, please note: **Staff cannot heat up lunches in the microwave.** If you send a hot lunch in a metal Thermos-style container, please allow it to cool off a bit before closing the lid, or it will be heat sealed shut by the time your child tries to eat it at lunch.



#### **Volunteer Requirements**

One of the major strengths of St. Mary's Catholic School is our community. This community sustains the school financially, spiritually and socially. A general volunteer expectation produces a strong school community.

**All families are expected to volunteer 30 hours per year** (15 in the Fall, 15 in the Spring) for major fundraisers, community events, classroom needs, and various campus projects. Volunteer opportunities will be updated throughout the year on the school website under the *Support* tab, then *Volunteer*.

If your family is unable to volunteer the required 30 hours, volunteer time will be billed through FACTS at a rate of \$15/hour. School employees and HASA Board Members are exempt from the volunteer requirement. And certainly, any family facing serious or unforeseen circumstances (i.e. hospitalization, etc.) may meet with the principal to discuss their situation.

#### Safe Environment Training

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Dallas has implemented a Safe Environment Program for Parishes and Schools. You may access safe environment information at <a href="https://www.cathdal.org">www.cathdal.org</a>. The purpose of this program is to provide protection for both children and adults by informing adults of appropriate behavior toward children. St. Mary's Catholic School fully participates in this program. Each staff member and parent volunteer is required to be trained and to comply with all of the requirements and expectations.

All staff members and parents will fill out an application and submit to a criminal background check. Safe Environment training must be completed yearly, and background checks are updated every two years. All of these records are kept confidential, maintained in the principal's office, and secured at all times. Access is granted ONLY to those with a "Need to Know."

#### **Attendance**

Students are expected to attend school every school day, personal illness and family emergencies being the exception. Parents/guardians must sign their child out at the receptionist's office each time he/she needs to leave the school during the school day.

On the day following the absence the student is to provide the teacher with a signed and dated note from his/her parent/guardian explaining the reason for the absence. All absences without a doctor's note are considered unexcused.

If your child is going to be absent, the parent/guardian must contact the school by 8:30 a.m. each day of the student's absence. Partial day absences are recorded. An absence of two hours or more in the morning or afternoon will be considered as a half-day absence. Therefore any child that arrives after 10:15 am or leaves prior to 2 pm will automatically be recorded half-absent. Students may not exceed more than (10) absences for the school year without serious reason.

#### **Early Arrival Program**

The Early Arrival Program (EAP) is available Monday through Friday from 7:30 – 7:55 PM. Only children enrolled in St. Mary's Catholic School (SMS) are eligible to participate in the program. The school does not offer EAP when closed or on late arrival days. EAP follows a discipline where students may read, study or complete homework (coloring for young children) until they are dismissed to their classrooms. All program workers are Safe Environment approved with at least two employees minimum. Students may be dropped off at the school entrance. NO STUDENT MAY ARRIVE EARLIER THAN 7:30 AM.

#### **After-School Program**

The After-School Program (ASP) is open to any student enrolled full day in the school and runs from 3:40 PM - 5:30 PM. Before a student can participate in the After-School Care Program, the parent(s)/guardian(s) need to fill out an ASP Agreement. For students who are not picked up by 5:30 PM there is a charge of \$1 per minute until the student is picked up.

#### **DISMISSAL PROCEDURE/TRAFFIC PATTERN**

- Students will assemble in the Gym for afternoon prayers and dismissal.
- Family names will be projected on the Gym wall in the order parents are lined up outside for dismissal.
- The dismissal policy requires students be dismissed from the Gym and placed into vehicles by a school employee.
- The pick-up lane must move quickly and consistently. A total of six vehicles may load at one time. Therefore, please proceed forward as far as you can. If a



- child is not present or ready to be picked up, then the vehicle driver will be asked to circle to the back of the line.
- Children are to enter on the RIGHT side of the car ONLY.
- Texas State Law prohibits the use of cellphones while driving within one block of any school campus.
- Students are required to wait in the Gym. Please DO NOT ask your child to meet you at another location on the school grounds.
- If you pick your child up in the school, you may not enter or exit through the Gym doors at the circular drive. Please park in the parking lot and enter through the front doors of the school.
- If you send a person to pick up your child who is not an authorized individual, please contact the school so all involved can be alerted to the change. Please make the change in the child's FACTS account. If there is any question in the mind of a supervisor as to who is picking up a child, that individual will be asked to produce identification and we may call the parent to verify the identity of the individual.

The school does not have personnel to watch students after dismissal. Therefore any student not picked up by 3:45 PM will be sent to the After-School Program and subject to drop-in charges. The school office officially closes at 3:45 PM.


